HNDU creation 2013

'Future of Heating Meeting the Challenge', published in March 2013, established Heat Networks Delivery Unit (HNDU) to;

"encourage and enable Local Authorities in England and Wales to undertake the development stages of heat networks".

HNDU support = grant funding + guidance

Heat network development stages

- 1. Heat mapping
- 2. Energy masterplanning

- 3. Feasibility studies
- 4. Detailed project development

Area-wide exploration, identification and prioritisation of heat network project opportunities

Project specific - An increasingly detailed investigation of the technical feasibility, design, financial modelling, business modelling, customer contractual arrangements and delivery approach, leading to investment grade project proposal(s)



HNDU support for Local authorities





How and who can HNDU help?

- Local Authorities in England or Wales
- Grant funding up to **67%** of total eligible external costs provided under Section 31 of Local Government Act and confirmation that 33% (or greater) funding is secured



But it's not just about the money

Supported projects also receive guidance from HNDU

HNDU Project Leads have the following expertise:

- Project scoping and management
- Engineering and technical standards
- Consumer protection
- Governance models and contractual structures
- Financial sources and structuring
- Policy compliance and opportunities
- Public sector procurement
- Managing stakeholders
- Risk management





Guidance from HNDU Project Leads

Guidance provides points for consideration (as opposed to advice which advocates a course of action)

- Initial contact recommendations from application assessment, identify support needs
- Inception meeting and site visit
- Review and provide points for consideration on:
 - draft **specifications and tender documents** (inc example tender specs)
 - to tender responses
 - key project outputs (consultancy report drafts)
- Possibility to attend initial and subsequent key meetings with appointed consultants
- Regular contact including to discuss monthly progress reports



Successful local authorities remain responsible for all project aspects

and HNDU project leads cannot...

- Undertake specific pieces of work for the local authority
- Create heat network project documents for local authority
- Provide financial advice or any other advice
- Participate actively in local authority procurement

Successful local authorities must...

- Agree to share documentation created with HNDU grant funding
- Ensure State Aid and procurement rules are complied with



HNDU cannot fund

- Heat sources only projects, where supplying network isn't primary function
- Work already commissioned at the time of this application
- Capital or operational costs of heat networks
- Funding for local authority staff or seconded staff costs
- Funding for accommodation
- Funding for stakeholder events or workshops.

HNDU will only fund more than one stage in logical groupings. It will not fund more advanced stages without clear evidence that the early stages have been undertaken, and it will not normally fund all project stages in a single application, as early stages might conclude that there is not a viable project or that a very different project is preferable to pursue.



Application description – one page:

- Summary of the heat network opportunities (including, locations and where available, heat sources, heat demand and heat connections/customer types)
- Why exploring the opportunities for heat networks (aims and benefits) and what has triggered this work
- What grant funding and guidance is being sought from HNDU which development stages does this cover and what barriers would HNDU support help to address



Application assessment criteria

- Quality of previously completed heat network development stages
- Local authority commitment, letter of support from the relevant Project Sponsor and Councillor holding the relevant portfolio, and officer capacity
- How strongly does the project link with DECC's decarbonisation objectives
- Is the project (or is it likely to become) a credible prospect for commercial / financial development

- Project management capacity has been considered
- Please ensure all required documents are included
